Collection Abstract: The Texas-Southeastern Railroad Company, incorporated on September 22, 1900 and chartered on October 9, 1900, was a short line railroad connecting Diboll, Texas with Lufkin, Texas. It was founded by T. L. Temple of the Southern Pine Lumber Company, and was primarily used by the company to transport forest products to and from the Diboll mill, connecting to the mainline St. Louis & Southwestern Railway in Lufkin. Today (in 2010) the railroad is fully owned by Temple-Inland, Inc., it no longer maintains track to Lufkin, and it primarily provides switching services for various industrial plants at Diboll, connecting with the Union Pacific. This collection contains legal documents, contracts, financial records, timebooks, minutes, printed material, freight correspondence, profile maps, retirement plans, and annual reports filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission, State Tax Board, and Railroad Commission of Texas. It also contains similar records of the Lufkin, Hemphill & Gulf Railway Company and Southern Pine Lumber Company due to their relationships with the TSE.

Biographical/Historical Note: Thomas Lewis Latane Temple, president of Southern Pine Lumber Company and leader of other lumber and railroad interests in eastern Texas, organized the Texas Southeastern Railroad Company (TSE) in 1900, primarily to serve his timber harvesting and lumber manufacturing interests centered in Angelina County, Texas.

TSE evolved from an unincorporated logging railroad that served sawmill operations at Diboll, in the southern end of Angelina County. TSE's mainline initially ran about thirteen miles northeastward from Diboll and connected with the Cotton Belt mainline east of Lufkin, the county seat. In 1906 TSE began relocating its mainline northwestward from Diboll, reaching into Trinity and Houston counties, a distance of about eighteen miles, and added a ten mile spur from Blix to Lufkin in 1908. By 1922, TSE had completed construction of mainline track to the logging camp known as Fastrill, in Cherokee County, a distance of more than fifty miles from Diboll, but TSE did not officially operate trains over most of this northern mileage. Instead, Southern Pine Lumber Company trains handled the northern traffic, which was nearly all logs. In addition, numerous Southern Pine Lumber Company logging spurs branched off the TSE mainline to access area timber resources.

Through the years, TSE abandoned most of its track mileage, beginning in the 1940s, following Southern Pine Lumber Company's abandonment of large scale railroad based logging camps. Passenger service was discontinued in 1942. At Lufkin, TSE connected with the Cotton Belt line, which gave it favorable rate divisions on the lumber manufactured by Southern Pine Lumber Company (SPLC). TSE and SPLC were owned and operated by essentially the same persons. Through various business transactions, SPLC became Temple Industries in 1963, Temple-Eastex in 1975, and Temple-Inland in 1984. TSE, essentially a Temple family business since 1900, became part of Temple-Inland in 1992. In 1996 Temple-Inland sold TSE's spur into Lufkin and TSE then became only a switching railroad at Diboll. TSE leased the Texas State Railroad between Palestine and Rusk (33 miles) from November 1962 through December 1969 and operated the line as its Northern Division.

In 1921 T.L.L. Temple acquired the Lufkin, Hemphill & Gulf Railway, which operated 11 miles of track in Sabine County between Hemphill and Bronson, as well as the Knox Lumber Company properties at Hemphill. The mill at Hemphill, built in 1912, burned in 1937 and was not rebuilt, and the LH&G was abandoned the same year. Temple also owned other lumber operations nearby at Pineland. These operations were merged with those of Southern Pine Lumber Company in 1956.

Collection Scope and Content:

The collection has been arranged into three subgroups being the Texas South-Eastern Railroad (TSE); Lufkin, Hemphill & Gulf Railway (LHG); and Southern Pine Lumber Company. This arrangement was imposed because no original order could be determined and it best organizes the records by creator.

The TSE subgroup includes legal documents, contracts, financial records, time books, profile maps, right of way maps, land survey maps, blueprints, minutes, printed material, freight correspondence, photographs, retirement plans, and annual reports filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC), State Tax Board, and Railroad Commission of Texas. They document the business activities of the TSE between 1902-1993, such as right-of-way agreements, freight negotiations, employee payroll, railroad accidents, equipment purchases, track usage and related agreements, company accounting, stockholder decisions, track development, and annual activities and financial information.

The Lufkin, Hemphill & Gulf records, collectively dated 1917-1937, includes legal documents, financial records, profile maps, voucher registers, board meeting minutes, and a few reports submitted to the ICC. These records document LHG right-of-way and track usage agreements, the 1921 sale of the Knox Lumber Company to Temple Lumber Company, company finances and employee payrolls, accounts of equipment, changes in property, railroad valuations, stock issues, and annual company statistics on finances, freight, and other operations.

The Southern Pine Lumber Company records, dated between 1902-1986, primarily documents the company's railroad activities as opposed to their lumber operations. It is the smallest subgroup of the three, and includes right-of-way agreements with the Texas and Louisiana Railroad, a time book, a log transit record for Pineland, and a log of inbound and outbound rail traffic.

Series I: Legal Documents, 1907-1969

Scope and Content: This series has been divided into four subseries being Legal Instruments and Related Correspondence, Real Estate, Railroad Accidents, and Court Records. It contains information on TSE contracts with other companies, real estate owned and leased by the company, track abandonment, accidents caused by the railroad, and a case involving the Tennessee Central Railway Company.

Subseries I: Legal Instruments and Related Correspondence

Scope and Content: The legal instruments subseries consists of contracts, deeds, a mortgage note, proxy agreements, release of damage agreements, and a patent purchase. The purchases of equipment document TSE's acquisition of new rail cars, rails, oil, and other operating equipment. These may also include agreements with express companies concerning transporting express freight. Also included are right-of-way agreements between the TSE and other railroads or companies concerning use of the TSE right-of-way, constructing utility pipes or lines below or above TSE tracks, or allowance of other railroads to construct their own right-of-way across TSE track. These files include related correspondence and blueprints. Some files of right-of-way agreements only contain correspondence and the contract is not present. These records are arranged chronologically.

Subseries II: Real Estate

Scope and Content: This subseries consists of three folders documenting land transactions involving the TSE. The land purchased from D. C. Moore was located in Trinity County around the Eastern Texas Railroad’s right-of-way. Also included is a certificate of title concerning the oil and mineral lease history of land of the J. D. Jones Survey, and the final document is a list of land leased by the TSE showing owner, amount, acreage, and location. They are arranged chronologically.

Series II: Annual Reports and Correspondence to the Interstate Commerce Commission, 1905-1959

Scope and Content: This series consists of annual reports filed by the TSE to the Interstate Commerce Commission. They provide a wealth of information on the railroads history, including lists of owners and officers, stock information, descriptions of property operated or leased, funded debt, cost information on road and property construction or improvements, income and earnings statements, a description of stocks and bonds owned, expense reports, balance sheets, employee and salary information, traffic and mileage statistics, freight information, descriptions of equipment, descriptions of mileage, accident statistics, characteristics of road, and other information. Later reports are entitled “Form C” but contain the same information. Also included is correspondence between the ICC and TSE concerning criticisms and comments on information within the reports. They are organized chronologically.

Series III: Annual Reports and Correspondence to the Railroad Commission of Texas, 1909-1971

Scope and Content: This series consists of annual reports of the TSE submitted to the Railroad Commission of Texas. The information in these reports is very similar to the reports submitted to the Interstate Commerce Commission, including officer and stockholder information, balance sheets and other financial records, funded debt, account changes to road and property, investments, depreciation, operating and freight statistics, a summary of track mileage, and other information. Reports dated 1956-1971 are called "Form C" but contain the same information. The correspondence is between the TSE and Railroad Commission concerning discrepancies and clarification regarding the reports. The records have been arranged chronologically.

Series VI: Financial Records, 1903-1980

Scope and Content: The financial records series consists of 14 subseries documenting the financial, personnel, taxation, payroll, and accounting activities of the TSE. In addition to financial information, they provide a record of individuals who worked for the railroad, railroad wages, and living expenses. The majority of the records are oversize files or ledgers, while others are standard folder size. The records include employee time books; accounting ledgers; registers of waybills; freight bill registers; accounts of equipment, buildings, and land; cash books; voucher registers; bank ledgers; operating revenue records; tax records; and other financial documents.

Subseries I: Employee Records

Scope and Content: The employee records subseries consists of documents relating to TSE employees such as time books, an employee payment history, and a compensation report. The time books provide a record of employees and includes occupations, deductions, and amounts employees were paying for the company hospital, rent, and insurance. They are organized chronologically. The employee payment history volume provides an alphabetical record of TSE employees between 1936 and 1946. The information includes employee name, address, pay rate, monthly earning history, and time worked. The compensation report also provides a list of TSE employees with monthly compensation values.

Subseries IV: Financial Registers

Scope and Content: The registers series consists of multiple types of financial registers providing a record of bills, vouchers, and accounts payable. The registers of waybills received document freight amounts and money collected by the TSE per month. The freight bill registers are similar to the waybills received volumes, stating freight amount, total amount collected, number, and if the freight was prepaid. The bills collectible register documents money collected from various railroad, lumber, and other companies with the corresponding credited accounts, showing bill number, amount, date paid, rendered to, synopsis (description of service), and credit information. The voucher registers record a list of payments made by the TSE to various companies and individuals for services performed, including maintenance to rights-of-way and other equipment. These volumes show voucher number, date paid, favor, synopsis, amount, sundry accounts, and category of service rendered. The register of construction and equipment accounts provides a record of payments made by the TSE concerning track and equipment maintenance and construction. The registers of accounts payable also show payments made by TSE for track maintenance and structures and transportation expenses, including injured persons, buildings, and telegraph line.

The sketches includes notes on ties and measurements. The other forms provide statistics and cubic yardage on grading, amount of Earth filling, Earth surfacing, roadbed excavation, ditches and chanel, loos rock, rails, joints, ties, bolts, and other track materials. The information includes account number, dates, description of property, description of maintenance or purchase, associated cost, cost percentages of labor versus material in figuring accurate costs, and depreciation information if applicable. This information pertains to steam locomotives and freight cars, passenger cars, station and office buildings, work equipment, shops and engine houses, shop machinery, ties, bridges, trestles, and culverts. They provide a good record of equipment used by railroads during the early to mid twentieth-century. They have been arranged by account type.

Series VIII: Freight Correspondence, 1908-1965

Scope and Content: The freight correspondence series consists of correspondence between TSE freight agents and track managers, and those of other railroads, documenting negotiations of freight shipping rates. Texas South-Eastern employees W. G. Menefee, R. A. Jackson, and E. C. Durham are the most frequent correspondents. The files have been kept in their original filing system created by the railroad. Three indexes provide access to these records. One is arranged by topic providing separate sections for quotations, rates to different points, Temple Lumber Company Yards – Routing, relations Inter and Intra Company, Divisions, ICC Investigation and Suspension Dockets, and Railroad Commission of Texas Railroad Dockets, and price quotations – office supplies. The topical index also contains entries on claims against the railroad for livestock killed demurrage, transit privileges, contractor’s outfitter, lumber, and equalization. The other two are arranged in alphabetical order, which is determined by the first letter in each file title. The correspondence also discusses freight rates for the Lufkin, Hemphill and Gulf Railway. Not all of the correspondence listed in the indexes is present.

Series IX: Maps and Blueprints, 1908-1980

Scope and Content: This series contains TSE profile maps, right of way maps, survey maps, and blueprints. There are 24 TSE profile and right of way maps. The profile maps show a cross section, or side profile, of TSE track with distance measurements, relationship of the track and the Earth's surface, grade measurements, filings, intersections with roads and other tracks, buildings along the tracks, and bridge locations. These are largely dated 1908 or 1918 and were completed by the Office of the Chief Engineer, with chief engineer being J. E. Mitchell. Included is one right-of-way map showing an overhead depiction of miles 1-4 and the track's relationship to surrounding properties, listing land owners. Also included is a complete map of TSE track circa 1922, a profile map of the Texas State Railroad dated 1917, and blueprints for a Columbia Gulf Transmission Company pipeline dated 1980. The land survey maps are those listed in the map cabinet, most of which document track layout on the J. A. Bonton Survey where TSE track and U.S. Highway 94 intersected in Lufkin's industrial district. The blueprints are from Baldwin Locomotive Works and deal with steam locomotive operations. Not all maps are dated. Map numbers are in parentheses.

Series III: Annual Reports, 1937

Scope and Content: The annual reports series consists of a report to the Interstate Commerce Commission and one filed with the Texas State Tax Board. These records are the same as those under the Texas South-Eastern subgroup and provide information on organizational history, stockholders and directors, stock, debt, assets and liabilities, taxation, track statistics, mileage, depreciation and changes in property, freight statistics, and earnings and expenses.

Series IV: Profile and Right-of-Way Maps, 1917-1920

Scope and Content: This series contains 17 profile and right-of-way maps of the LHG. The profile maps show a cross section, or side profile, of LHG track with distance measurements, relationship of the track and the Earth's surface, grade measurements, filings, intersections with roads and other tracks, buildings along the tracks, and bridge locations. These are dated 1917. Included is a complete set of right-of-way map showing an overhead depiction of the track's path and relationship to surrounding properties, listing land owners, also dated 1917. Also included are complete LHG track maps showing the relationship of the tracks with other southeast Texas railroads and highways, circa 1920. Not all maps are dated.

Subgroup III: Southern Pine Lumber Company Records, 1902-1986

Scope and Content: The Southern Pine Lumber Company Records are the smallest subgroup within this collection, and because of the small quantity, they are not divided into series or subseries. These records are similar to those of the TSE and LHG and include contracts, a time book, logs of transit at

Pineland and an inbound-outbound traffic log, a map, a mortgage note, and claim ledgers. The time book documents pay and hours worked for all Southern Pine Lumber Company divisions, including the shop, watchmen, yard workers, mill workers, and sales. The claim ledgers document the company's collection or payment of freight, demurrage, and transit costs incurred while working with other railroads. The information includes date, Southern Pine claim number, railroad claim number, car identification numbers, account type, amount, and date paid. The ledger dated 1953-1987 provides origin and destination of shipments as well. The Inbound/Outbound transit logs document Southern Pine's and Temple Lumber Company's tracking of freight cars with date, car identification numbers, contents, destination, weight, and freight rate.
