The Reverend Henry Waring Latané Temple and Dr. Warner Lewis Papers predominantly consists of sermons given by Episcopal minister Henry Waring Latané Temple, as well as 19th century books on religion, philosophy, and education owned by Temple and physician Augustine Warner Lewis. Included are a few of Lewis's medical notebooks and lab books with a focus on chemistry.

Biographical/Historical Note:

Henry Waring Latané Temple was born on April 6, 1812. He married Susan Jones and they resided in Wayland, Essex County, Virginia. Temple was an Episcopal minister, serving at St. Paul's and St. John's churches as well as others in counties along the Rappahannock River. The Temples had numerous children: John Newton Temple (1847-1899), Mary Temple (1849-1923), Loulie Temple (1851-1924), Annie Waring Temple (1857-1947), Matilda Temple (died young), Thomas Lewis Latané Temple (1859-

1935), Joseph Temple (died young), William Temple (died young), Charles H. T. Temple (1855-1881), and William Temple (1861-1939). Henry Temple died on February 13, 1871 and Susan Jones died in 1864.

Augustine Warner Lewis was born on December 24, 1885 to Dr. Warner Lewis (1844-1917/1918) and Mary temple (1849-1923). Like his father, Lewis was also a physician in Virginia. He married Blanch Varn (d. 1958) and they had four children: Augustine Warner Lewis, Jr. (1914-1968), Blanche Temple Lewis (b. 1913), Julia Temple Lewis (b. 1928), Dr. Edward Arthur Lewis (1917-1967), and Mary Temple Lewis (died young).

Collection Scope and Content:

The Temple Family Collection, 19th Century predominantly consists of sermons of Episcopal reverend Henry Waring Latané Temple. On few occasions within 1860s sermons, Temple mentions the Confederacy or Jefferson Davis in passing. Eighteenth and 19th century books on religion, religious leaders, philosophy, and education make up a substantial portion of the collection as well. A small amount of material was contributed by physician Augustine Warner Lewis such as the medical school notebook with a focus on chemistry.
