The Temple family, through Thomas Lewis Latané Temple, has had a profound impact on Diboll, Texas and the East Texas lumber industry. This collection contains 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century books owned by early members of the Temple and Lewis families, reflecting their careers as ministers, doctors, and students, as well as revealing their personal interests.

## Biographical/Historical Note:

The Temple family, particularly Thomas Lewis Latané Temple, has had a profound impact on Diboll, Texas and the East Texas lumber industry. The Temple family traces its origins to Essex County, Virginia. John Temple, born in 1771, married Mary Latané, born in 1785, on January 1, 1804. They had four children: Lucy Temple, Arthur Temple, born in 1804, John Temple (1806-1829), Henry Waring Latané Temple (1812-1871).

It is through H. W. L. Temple's lineage that Diboll was founded and thrived as an East Texas lumber community. H. W. L. Temple, an Episcopalian minister, married Susan Jones and they resided in Wayland, Essex County, Virginia. They had ten children, among them John Newton Temple (1847-1899), Mary Temple (1849-1923), Loulie Temple (1851-1924), Annie Waring Temple (1857-1947), and Thomas Lewis Latané Temple (1859-1935). T. L. L. Temple later moved to Texarkana, Arkansas and established

the Southern Pine Lumber Company, creating the company town of Diboll, Texas along the Houston, East & West Texas Railway in 1894. Company leadership would pass onto T. L. L.'s son Arthur Temple (1894-1951), and then to his son Arthur Temple, Jr. (1920-2006).

Members of the Lewis family married several H. W. L. Temple daughters. Mary Temple married Warner Lewis (1844-1917); Loulie Temple married Catesby Latané Lewis (born in 1846); and Annie Waring Temple married Reverend Joseph Lewis (1858-1925). Warner Lewis was a doctor and Joseph Lewis was a minister; the occupation of Catesby Latané Lewis is not known.

### **Collection Scope and Content:**

The Temple Family Book Collection contains 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century books owned by early members of the Temple and Lewis families, reflecting their careers as ministers, doctors, and students, as well as revealing their personal interests. The family members include Reverend Henry Waring Latané Temple, Reverend Joseph Lewis, Dr. Warner Lewis, A. Temple, S. W. Lewis, Willie Temple, Mary Elizabeth Walington, Mary Temple, Henry Latané Lewis, Augustine Warner Lewis, Loulie Temple, Amos Bennett, John Newton Temple, Judith W. Breckenbrough, Lucy Latané Lewis, Maggie Hodges, Philip W. Smoot, Nannie Lewis, John Latané, and Lucy S. Temple. The majority of the books are biographies on Christian pastors from both Europe and the United States, and books concerning Christianity, sermons, histories of Biblical figures, and other religious topics. Some books are school textbooks, primarily belonging to Nannie Temple, and others reflect personal family interests such as translated works of poetry, the *Commentaries of Caesar*, or biographies of George Washington.

The books have been organized by owner and then chronologically by publication date. They have signatures of the owners on the inside covers or title page, and some have more elaborate notes and writings. The books are in poor condition with visible water and insect damage to the covers and beginning pages, but interior pages remain in good condition. Some books are in Latin or French.

**Arrangement:** The books have been organized by owner and then chronologically by publication date, as opposed to a traditional alphabetically organized bibliography.
