## Collection Abstract:

This collection of records of the Angelina County School Superintendent's Office documents the students, teachers, school buildings, and administration of Angelina County schools from 1885-1971. Included are minute books, school census records, teacher registers, financial records, school photographs, school bonds, and student permanent record cards. The records also provide insight into the debate over state versus local control of schools.

## Biographical/Historical Note:

Although Anglo settlers began settling in the area now known as Angelina County as early as 1801, large-scale settlement did not begin until Texas gained its independence in 1836. These early settlers most likely provided rudimentary schooling for their children at home, with lessons taught by parents or others hired for the job. Angelina County was formed in 1846 and schooling continued as it had before. The first documentary evidence of an organized county school comes from 1848, in reference to an election to be held at the school in the Renfro community. Families who could afford to pay a teacher or could spare children from farm chores organized home schools until 1854, when the county Commissioner's Court divided the county into thirty-two school districts. The County Judge had

jurisdiction over the county schools, although the trustees of each school generally hired and fired the teachers and arranged for the day-to-day operations of the schools. In 1907, the Texas Legislature mandated that each county elect a County School Superintendent. This office had jurisdiction over county schools until all schools were consolidated into independent school districts. In 1971 the office was abolished. Throughout this time, some schools gradually consolidated and gained independence. The records in this collection mainly concern those schools directly under the jurisdiction of the county. There are some mentions in several record groups of the independent districts, but these district records are not extensive.

For an extensive explanation of the county school/independent district issues and more about these records see the December 2010 *Pine Bough* magazine, published by The History Center and available for download on their website.

### **Collection Scope and Content:**

All of the records in this collection date from 1885-1971, with the bulk from 1911-1971, during the tenure of the Angelina County School Superintendents. It is almost certainly not a complete collection of the County School Superintendent's records. A large portion of the collection concerns school board minutes, reports of the superintendent, expenses, and records of county teachers. This collection documents the students, teachers, school buildings, and administration of Angelina County public schools until 1971 when the Texas Legislature, at the request of state Senator Charlie Wilson, abolished the office of Angelina County School Superintendent. The records also provide insight into the debate over state versus local control of schools.

### Access and Use

**Access Restrictions:** Portions restricted per 42 U. S. C. 408(a)(8).

**Acquisition Information:** Accession 2004:022 was donated by the Angelina County Historical Commission on April 15, 2004. Accession 2005:008 was donated by the Angelina County Historical Commission on February 21, 2005.

**Custodial History:** County officials in charge of the schools (County Judge 1846-1907, County School Superintendent 1907-1971) kept these records as official county records. The county maintained the records until the early 1980's when former County School Superintendent and Historical Forum member Howard Walker discovered the county was in the process of destroying them, since the county no longer had jurisdiction over schools with the abolition of the County School Superintendent's post in 1971. Mr. Walker joined Ted Maberry and other members of the Angelina County Historical Forum in organizing an archives room and museum in the Angelina County Courthouse. In the 1990's the county remodeled the courthouse and needed the space for other offices. Many of the county's older records were stored offsite. In 2004 and 2005 the Angelina County Historical Commission took possession of these records and gifted them to The History Center so that they would be accessible to the public for research and would also be housed in a stable environment.

The latter half of the book contains records of teachers applying for exams and records of teacher's accounts that were approved for payment.
