Collection Abstract: The Hawkins Dunlap collection primarily concerns the Dr. Jesse Wise Hawkins, Angelina County physician and World War I veteran, and his grandson Lynn Hawkins Dunlap, editor of the *Lufkin Daily News*. The collection contains genealogical information, photographs, news articles, awards, framed items, and plaques from the years 1914-1977.

Biographical/Historical Note: Dr. Jesse Wise Hawkins was born October 17, 1875 in Camden, Arkansas and died February 26, 1942 in Lufkin, Texas. He and wife Katherine Willborg had one daughter, Marguerite, who married William Dunlap. Marguerite and William's son Lynn Hawkins Dunlap became a news editor for the *Lufkin Daily News*. Among other honors, he received awards for a series of articles on the abuse of patients in nursing homes in Texas.

Collection Scope and Content: This collection contains articles on Dr. J. W. Hawkins, who served during World War I and was also a physician in Angelina County. Other items primarily concern former *Lufkin Daily News* editor Lynn Dunlap. Items include genealogical information, awards, news articles, photographs, plaques, and framed items from the family's hunting clubhouse and Mr. Dunlap's office.
