Collection Abstract: This collection contains images, publications, correspondence, maps and oversize items collected by Richard Wilson Keeling while traveling to remote areas of East Texas and Louisiana or through correspondence with fellow railroad and lumber history enthusiasts. They chronicle the rise and fall of steam locomotives and lumber companies from 1860-2001.

Biographical/Historical Note: Richard Wilson Keeling was born on September 10, 1907, in Vieques, Puerto Rico, to William Butler Keeling and Harriet Gertrude "Hattie" Maxwell. His family relocated to Houston, Texas, where he received an education in engineering and geology at The Rice Institute. He married Katie Vee Keeton on October 17, 1934, with whom he had three sons. Much of Richard's career was spent in the oil and gas industry doing seismic and survey work. This allowed him to travel frequently to remote areas of East Texas and Louisiana, visiting abandoned railroads and sawmill sites; as well as surviving lumber companies in the 1950s and 1960s. When not working, he reached out to employees of the railroads and lumber companies, establishing contacts for future research. Richard met or corresponded with fellow enthusiasts across the county, including the Gulf Coast Railroad Club, Southwest Railroad Historical Society, and National Railway Historical Society. He died in March 1969.

Collection Scope and Content: The Murry Hammond collection is arranged in five series. The first series contains cabinet cards, photographs, photographic postcards, script coins and slides related to the railroad and logging industries in East Texas from 1860-2001, undated.

The second series contains publications from the lumber industry and various logging companies throughout East Texas from 1902-1992, undated.

The third series contains articles written by Richard Wilson Keeling and correspondence regarding efforts to locate rare steam locomotives, collaborations with fellow enthusiasts, membership with Gulf Coast Railroad Club Inc., and the decline of sawmills throughout East Texas from 1838-1968, undated.

The fourth series contains maps showing right of way for tracks and stations, topographic surveys, lumber towns, plats, and timber possessions from 1903-1969, undated.

The fifth series contains oversize items, including photographic record, company records, cabinet cards and publications regarding the railroad and logging industries from 1878-1987, undated.
