My Dear Sister & Family:-

Pardon the delay in writing you, but as I told you when I was down there a few weeks ago, that I would write you as soon as I learned more about the affairs in Caldwell, Texas. I was down there last week Erin and my self, you see Preston had a deed and a will also we had the deed set a side last December 12th, 1938 then Preston and his lawyers came out with the will, and same was up for probat in county court Oct. 2. 1939 I was there, and the judge gave the decision in Preston favor, you see Prestons lawyer is a brother to the county judge in whoes court the will was for probate so we did not get a fair trial and deal in the matter, we are appealing the case to Dist. court which meet for five weeks begaining November 13th, 1939 and our case will come up some time after Nov. 13. 1939.

You see the appeal will come up before the same Dist. Judge, as the case did as of December 12th, 1938 he set the deeds a side and declared them void, on the grounds that our late uncl~~as~~ was of unsound mind, I am of the opinion the the same judge will set the will a side and declared it null and void on the same grounds as the declared the deeds void.

I am enclosing here with a form which I will ask you to please sign your names in this manner Mrs. Esther Pennington Ramsey, a Widow sign in this manner and mail at once to Mr. W.M. Hilliard, Atty. Caldwell, Texas, you will note that it is only giving our attorney the power to appeal the case to District Court be sure that you attend to this at once, so that we can get the case in this turn of Court, if we dont get the case in this turn of Court, it will be next may or the spring term of Court, we want to get the matter all cleared up by the first of the year. so sign the enclosed form and mail at once to the above stated.

We are all well only light colds, I had a card from Ornage yesterday, they were all well wrote like they might be up for the fair a day or two. Tressie will be off from tonight till next Tuesday five days in a row however she will get here pay just the same, Saw Curtis, he sure thinks he smart he is doing everything in his power to stop everything, but I dont think he will mave much luck. I am today sending Orange a copy of the same that I am sending you, I have signed my copy so has Erin, I must be going as I have several letters to write and I have some special work to do later this evening will write more later and more fully, so get this paper off at once and let me hear from you all, with love and best wishes to all I am
