I did not ware my uniform as I think my suit look nicer. I told some folks that I was at Sheppard Field, and they said that I did not look like a soldier at all.

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who I met at the Church, it was Elezebeth Watson, she is going to a business College here at Wichita Falls. Believe me I sure was suprised and glad to see her too as she was the only person there that I knew. I think she was as bad suprised as I was.

Mama; has Dorthy and Toby bought them Another Cow yet? I am just Crazy to see Howard and all of you all. Dorthy sent me three (3) picture's, one of them was Alto holding Howard, one was you, + Dennerd + Emma Dean and one was Howard laying in his bed ~~with~~ propped up a little bit; they sure were good pictures. I got a Card from Ellis today, he

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said they were all O.K. he said Woodrow Muckleroy came by the station the other day and that he thought Woodrow was going to work for Good-Luck.

Has Ellis wrote you when he intended to come home? he may come when I come if I get to come about Nov 9th. I want to get some days off.

How is Mr Wallis getting along? I sent Evertie and Benney a pretty Card.

I must go as I don't have any news, take care of your self, Trusting I will hear from you all soon.

How did you cut your foot? did you do it with the ax? or hoe, you must not use those things. How do you like to drive the car? you must be very careful driving the car as it is so dangerous.

You know those Caps like I wanted to get one for you; cost \$3.49.

so I Guess I will have to let you some-
thing else. Oh yes; Ellis said he saw
Woodrow Milkleroy in Dallas the
other day. I thought he was still
living close to Houston.

Did Ellis write you that I was
getting fat? I don't think I am
any larger than I was when I was
at home. How are you progressing in
your school work? O.K. I hope. I
haven't started to school up
here yet; I don't know when I will
start if I pass the examination
they will give us. Oh yes; you should
see those air-planes they have up here.

You ask why I don't have my picture made ~~in~~ ^{with} my uniform on, I don't look nice enough as it is just plane kakaka. I will make some pictures pretty soon and send you all some. I guess I will have (4) four days when ^{and if} I get to come home about Nov 9th as I can't come until after pay day.

I was very very much surprised to

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see Elezebeth Watson at Church
up town Sunday morning. I think
she was as bad surprised as I was. I
sure was glad to see her as she was
the only person there that I knew.
She ask me all about every-body
down there; she said for you to be sure
and write too her. Her address is

first time I had been to Church
