long for me to get your letters

got home O.K. Ellis, you made
the trip pretty quick, how is
Dorothy and family? and did

Howard seem to know you?
Hope they are O.K. I don't know
why they don't write me as I
haven't heard from them
since I was down there, they
may have written me and I
failed to get it. maybe I will
hear from them before I move.
I guess we will move this
coming Tuesday or maybe before
then, hope I hear from you all
before I move also Dorothy &
family. I will write you all
and Dorothy a Card before we
move.

Mama, I hope you are feeling
O.K. by now. you should not
work and get too hot. You know
I told you about that when I

was at home. what all have you been making preserves from, and did you make a good bit of muskidime jelly? guess you all have canned plenty of pease by now. yes we are having plenty hot weather now, but not much rain. I was sorry to learn that you all had such a rain last monday and monday night.

Say Ellis, are the peanuts pretty good? hope so. I saw in the news where Drury McCauley was going to run a peanut thrasher, so I don't guess you will have any trouble getting some of your peanuts thrashed if you get to save them o.k. I got a card from Alford today, he said he

would have to get some help to pick his Cotton when it got dry enough. Say mama, did Ellis tell you about Everette going off Sunday night as soon as we ate supper, he said he was going back to the station to work, but he didn't. I don't know why he wanted to run off. Say, Dennerd I bet you and mama was very glad and a little surprised to see Ellis. I sure am glad he is back at home. I think he did "mighty" good while he was at Dallas. mama, I sent \$15.00 besides the five I borrowed from you when I was at home, but I guess Ellis told you about it.  got one to send to Lillie. Say Den,
 how are you liking school by
 now and do you like your ~~teachers~~
 Teachers? Do you think they will
 want you to pay 'bus' fare? hope not.
 Guess you have plenty note-books
 now as Emma said she sent you one.
