Yes we been having some hot weather and very dry, but it got real cold last Monday morning and came a fine rain Tuesday morning, but I don't like this cold weather in the summer time.

Guess you all were a bit surprised to see Emma Dean as she didn't think she would be off until the 28th. I thought maybe she might come up here as she had wrote me that she might come.

Have you been canning any peas and butter-beans? Hope you still have some of them when I get down.

P.S. How is Dorothy's family
 by now? hope they are O.K. you
 be sure and write me as soon as
 you get this.

There, guess the watermelons are
 looking good. Have you all
 had any ripe ones yet? I haven't
 ate any yet either as I think they
 are about 6 or 7 a pound.

Mama I think it is time
 you was answering my letter
 as I just got the one card
 from you in two (2) weeks, but
 I got Ellis's letter last week.
 Say Denard it is time you
 and Ellis was answering my
 letter too. Mama I am sending
 you the three dollars (\$3.00) for your
 perment and the money too pay
 for my paper, but I guess there will be
 a little over, out of the five (\$5.00) I am
 sending. take care of yourselves, and
 real soon, Love, Denard.
