Hope this finds you all O.K. I am about the same as usual except my hay-fever has been bothering me quite a bit. you know this Climate sure is bad on hay-fever.

Guess you all are having some Cool weather by now as it has been real Cold here, the temperature was down to 43 last Sunday Night, but it is still dry here. Glad you are doing good with the Cotton picking.

oh yes I also got letter's from Lillie and E.D this morning, they were able to be up and work.

what seem to be wrong with my Reffer.? glad she is O.K now. I will pay you all for doctoring her soon. what seems to be wrong with your yearling? hope he is O.K now. well I am glad you got that bond as I thought you was due to get it, but I am not buying any now.

Dorthey wrote me that she put in the order

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For Dad a moniumment, hope all of us will like it as I know she did what she thought would please all of us. I hope it is a pretty one as it cost almost a hundred dollars. If Alford or Della gives you all any money, you can give it to Dorthey as she and me paid for the moniumment except the twenty-four (\$24.⁰⁰) dollars that E.D. and Lillie put on it.

Mama if you will send me the numbers of those radio tubes I will see if I can get them ~~again~~ as there is a radio shop here on the field. I lost the numbers you sent me.

Lillie said in her letter that she would come with me if I come by Dallas on Sunday eve, but you know I want to come when I can get off wheather it is on Sunday or not, but I hope to get a pass pretty soon.

I attended a singing last Sunday afternoon, it was real good and I enjoyed it. yes I attended Church last Sunday morn and night as I usually go. Take Care of yourself, ans soon.
