to your letter which I was
glad to get today, guess I
will have more time to write my
letters this week than I had
last week.

Glad to learn that you
all were O.K, hope this finds you
all well, I would feel O.K if my
legs didn't ache some and I
have a new supply of Cold.

It sure came a norther last
night and is real Cold now,
looks like it may snow most

Anytime now, guess it would if it was a little bit colder.

Did Lillie Come home? hope she did for a few days rest as I know she needs it. I have not heard from her since I was down there.

yes I am glad you all got the Cotton picked, hope you all get all the feed saved OK, but I know those peanuts are going to be a bad job. Have you all sold the Cotton yet? hope you get 20 Cts a lb for it anyway.

Emma Dean never said anything in her letter to me about her taking nurses training, I

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don't think she would hold up" at that kind of work either as she is not a real strong person. Did you hear about Aunt Phres's mother passed away a short while back? sure is bad.

mama I don't know when I can see about that radio battery, but I will try to get it as soon as I can. you see I can't get to town before the stores close except on Saturday as I can't get off till five o'clock and they stay open later on Saturdays. I had not heard about Alford giving Dorthy the five dollars on the monument.

Oh yes I went to a singing last Sunday afternoon, it was pretty good. Guess you got the card with the picture of the Church on it. I told

the girl that you knew I go
to Church up here, but she wanted
me to address it to you anyways so
she could mail it to you. I may
move my membership up here
pretty soon.

You said Cross was working on
his house; they were doing that
when I was down there. Take care
of yourself, Ans soon.

all picked and that you got two bales.
you all sure have a big job gathering
the Corn and peanuts, hope you get
it all saved O.K. Have you Chewed
any more Cone and how tall is it
blue by now? you will have to send

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me a little bottle of syrup when
you all get it made.

Hope this finds you O.K., I am
not so good as I have took more
Cold. It sure is Cold here now, it
turned Cold again last night
and looks like it may snow
most anytime now.

Did Lillie Come home? Hope
she did as I know she needs a
few days rest. Glad you got
the Note-book and paper also the
pencils, but don't guess you
need those red pencils. You
really did make a good grade on
your Algebra, hope you keep making
good grades and you will if you

study pretty hard. you all must have a good foot-ball team, they havent lost but one game I dont think.

oh yes if you get any those large pecans that you and Dorthey were going to get; you will have to send me a few of them sometime with those small one's. Say I hope you can get a batch of those large scaly-bark hickory-nuts. Say how the hogs got out anymore? hope not. Boy I never will forget what a time me and you had getting them back in the pen when I was at home. Take Care of Yourself; Ans real soon.
