I, Mrs. Esther Ramsey, am the surviving wife of William Yancy Ramsey, who died April 12, 1939. Prior to our marriage, William Yancy Ramsey was married to Nettie L. Page, and on or about Jan. 1900, they were divorced. During their marriage only two children were born to them, namely: Cynthia Idella Ramsey now the wife of Cossie L. Clark and Herman Alford Ramsey. It is my understanding that at the time the divorce was granted, W.Y. Ramsey had a settlement with Nettie L. Ramsey and their daughter, "Della" Ramsey, turning over to Nettie L. Ramsey and Della Ramsey all their interest in any estate he then had;

William Yancy Ramsey and I, Esther Pennington Ramsey were married July 28, 1907. Some time after we~~re~~ were married, W.Y. Ramsey and I conveyed to H. Alford Ramsey 25 acres of land, which was in settlement to him of any claim he had or might have in any lands or estate of W.Y. Ramsey. That was our understanding;

During our marriage we had six children who survived^{age 35 yrs of age} W.Y. Ramsey, namely: Lillie Ramsey, /a feme-sole, Leonard Ramsey, a son 33 yrs. of age, Dorothy Ramsey Hughes (who is married to Alto Hughes) a daughter 30 years of age, Ellis Ramsey, a son 24 years of age, Dean Ramsey, a daughter, a feme-sole, 19 years of age and Pinkney Dennard Ramsey, a son, 13 years of age.

The above named parties are the heirs and only heirs of W.Y. Ramsey, deceased.
