Subject: Change of Duty.
Reference: (a) BuPers C/L 183-44 dated 29 June 1944.

1. In accordance with BuPers dispatch dated 7 February 1945 which cannot be quoted herein, and when directed by the Commander, Motor Torpedo Boat Squadron TWELVE, you will regard yourself detached from your present duty, and from such other duty as may have been assigned you, and will proceed via first available government transportation to the United States.

2. Upon your arrival in a port of the United States, you will proceed in accordance with reference (b) to the nearest naval establishment for the purpose of completing a medical examination comprehensive enough to distinguish whether or not you are in immediate need of hospital or medical treatment. Upon completion of this examination and treatment, where necessary, you will further proceed and report to the Commanding Officer, Motor Torpedo Boat Squadrons Training Center, Newport (Melville), Rhode Island, for temporary duty pending further assignment by BuPers.

3. You are authorized a delay of twenty-five (25) days in reporting to the Commanding Officer, Motor Torpedo Boat Squadrons Training Center; Newport (Melville), Rhode Island in obedience to these orders, such delay to count as leave.

4. You will keep the Bureau of Naval Personnel and your new station advised of your address.
