Rates for children five and under twelve years of age will be one-half of adult rate, sufficient being added to make rate end in "0" or "5".

In making rates between points not shown in this tariff, agents and conductors will collect three (3) cents per mile, observing minimum of twenty-five (25) cents for each adult fare and fifteen (15) cents for each child's fare, but in no case must rate so made exceed rate quoted to next station beyond destination. In making rates on mileage, if amount ends in odd cents, collect nearest amount ending in "0" or "5", adding or deducting, as the case may be.

### BAGGAGE

Rates for the transportation of excess baggage shall be for distances of thirty-four (34) miles and less, twelve (12) cents per one hundred pounds, and for distances exceeding thirty-four (34) miles, twelve (12) per cent of the regular first-class ticket rates ; provided, *first*, that the rate so made shall not exceed two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) per one hundred pounds ; and, *second*, that the charges on any shipment shall not be less than twenty-five (25) cents.

The amount of free baggage shall be, for each full-fare passenger, 150 pounds ; and for each "child's-rate" passenger, 75 pounds ; provided, that 250 pounds shall be the greatest weight of any one package to be checked as baggage.

### EXCEPTION

Baggage of theatrical companies shall not be subject to these rates, rules and regulations. Rates on theatrical baggage will be assessed in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Railroad Commission of Texas.
