Rates for children five and under twelve years of age will be one-half of adult rate, sufficient being added to make the rate end in whole cents; fraction of a cent to be considered whole cent.

In making rates between points not shown in this tariff, agents and conductors will collect three (3) cents per mile, observing minimum of twenty-five (25) cents for each adult fare and fifteen (15) cents for each child's fare, but in no case must rate so made exceed rate quoted to next station beyond destination. In making rates on mileage, fraction of a cent to be considered whole cent.

For mileages between points on the Texas South-Eastern Railroad Company, see Texas Lines' Mileage Circular No. 9-I, Agent Ira D. Dodge's I. C. C. No. 410, Page 387, supplements thereto or successive issues thereof.

Tickets old under authority of this Tariff will be honored in chair cars and coaches only.

BAGGAGE

Rates for transportation of excess baggage shall be eighteen (18) cents per hundred pounds with a minimum charge on any shipment of twenty-five (25) cents.

The amount of free baggage shall be, for each adult ticket, 150 pounds; and for each child's ticket, 75 pounds; provided, that 250 pounds shall be the greatest weight of any one piece of baggage checked.
